## SELECTMEN'S NEWS

Big news is that particularly nasty storm and power outage both lasting a little longer than our patience. Winter hadn't even begun on the calendar and we're knee deep and half out of sand, overtime budget and even trucks. At least the thermometer didn't plummet to sub zero readings after the storm which surely would have been the coup de grace.

And, yeah, after years of no major equipment failures we're sure getting it in spades. ## CHANGES TO THE BULLETIN

A Letter from the Editor

It has been more than twenty eight years since my mother, Virginia, printed the first copy of the Barnard Bulletin in April of 1986. Intended to keep the voters in the town informed about the important local issues, the Bulletin was delivered free to the voting residents of the town and allowed local businesses and trades people to advertize for a nominal fee.

Up until now I have continued the tradition of mailing the Bulletin at no charge to Barnard legal residents. However, the expense of publishing the Bulletin has steadily increased and recently my income has decreased. The Bulletin is facing a cash crunch, and in order to continue publishing, I am asking the readers of the printed, mailed, version to pay a subscription fee.

The out-of-pocket costs listed below are primarily incurred in printing and mailing the paper version of the Bulletin. These costs do not include, running and maintaining the computer hardware and software, the layout or production time, and do not include any compensation for the time spent by me, or any of the other dedicated contributors, in writing the articles printed each month.

The yearly subscription fee is based on the 2014 breakdown below:

### SNOWMOBILE CLUB NEWS

VAST trails are officially open but the mid December weather here in Barnard, as in many other parts of the state, has not been kind to the trail system. Our first pass out with the power unit was painfully slow with downed trees and limbs, many other trees hanging in the trail due to the weight of the ice and snow, and a tremendous amount of small brush bending down into the trail also due to ice and snow weight. We are working continually to clear the trails but again due to the amount of issues, progress is slow. We hope to have the trails rideable by December 22nd and ask any riders in the meantime to carry some sort of a cutting tool and to take some extra time to help remove obstacles as they are encountered, particularly the low hanging brush in the trail. We have a great base of close to two feet at this time and the snow is pack-able so once we get the drag going trail conditions should be excellent.

The club will host its annual Poker Ride on Sunday January 25th, trail conditions permitting. Starts will begin at the Barnard Town Hall at 9:00AM until 10:30AM and there will be ample snowmobile trailer parking at the Barnard Town Hall. The posted trail ride will be approximately 45 miles on the Barnard trail system. Coffee and pastry will be available at the start and a hot lunch will be available at the town hall finish. Price is \$10.00/hand and \$1.00 for each additional card. This is a great family event and all riders are encouraged to attend. ### ECFIBER NEWS

ECFiber was not immune to the effects of the recent winter storm, but the fiber optic network suffered only one major cable break that effected eight customers on Bowman Road. Nineteen drop lines that went from the main pass cable to the residence were brought down by the storm. As of December 16th only three ECF customers were still not reconnected to the network.

The main service interruptions were caused by the failure of several generators to come on line properly and power the various hubs collocated in various municipal or public buildings, and the loss of connection to internet links that connect ECFiber to the rest of the world. ECFiber will be working on procedures to better maintain the backup generators, and will be working on interconnecting the hubs to allow for connections that will bypass a failed part of the network.

Although ECF had hoped to reach 1,000 customers by the end of the year, that target will have to wait until 2015. It appears that 950 customers will be online by the end of the year.



As Marilyn Syme read the names and handed out the balls, friends and family members decorated the tree with 89 silver and gold balls, each bearing the name of a beloved person. Afterwards, people warmed up with hot cider and cookies. Our thanks to John Leavitt and Marilyn Syme for organizing this meaningful holiday ritual, to Marilyn for writing all the names and providing the refreshments, and to everyone who made donations to the Community Club for the balls.

Our next community event is the Christmas Eve service at the East Barnard Church, which begins at 5:30, followed by a bonfire and warm cider. "Home church" - a monthly opportunity to share fellowship together during the winter - will resume in January. Friends and family of Polly Leavitt have created a quilt in her memory for the Barnard Academy BEES annual raffle. As Polly had made the school's raffle quilts in recent years, it seemed only fitting to honor her community service with a memorial quilt. The quilt is made up of 35 sampler blocks, each containing a bit of bee-theme blue

fabric somewhere in the design. The blocks are linked by yellow strips and small blocks and borders of a blue bee fabric. The top of the unfinished quilt was displayed at the school during the "Really Rosie" performance, with the promise that the quilt will be completed in January. Charlotte Croft and Virginia Schlabach are coordinating the project, which was inspired by Polly's granddaughter Heidi Vogt. 
