SELECTMEN'S NEWS

How can it possibly be almost November already and time to scout out that ever elusive Chateaugay buck? We're enjoying the last of these dry, unseasonably warm October days with a successful last shot at the bass on the Connecticut River and a season ending motorcycle ride on that smooth as silk Vt Rt 12. We'd like to think our squawking back in the spring to Vtrans and local Representative Teo Zagar about its condition got some attention but who knows?

We used our most of our "tree removal" money in the highway budget this year to clean up the orchard in back of the Town Hall and Fable Farm is using the abundant apples to make cider. While we certainly wouldn't want you to think we're "on the take," it sounds like we might get a little sample. Delmar has dumped several loads of leaves from ditch cleaning onto their vegetable fields at Clark Farm so maybe we'll get a large sample! It's nice to see some of these formerly wasted things going to good use.

Road Foreman Lance Webster and his pretty good crew recently completed work for a Better Back Roads project under a grant that he secured earlier in the year. It consisted of a curtain drain installation on East Barnard Rd to abate ground water surfacing right in the middle of the road causing a perennial mud hole and bank slide area near the Webb House. Nearly 500 feet of 6" perforated pipe was installed at about 3 feet depth above the road to catch and divert migrating ground water. The ditch was stone lined and the lower bank stabilized with large stone. The grant will reimburse most of the \$10,000+ cost of the project.

One of our final Irene recovery projects will be completed before the end of the month on Green Gate Rd with replacement of an undersized culvert we stuck in right after the storm with a larger pipe arch. A similar installation a little further up the road will take place next construction season under a State structures grant bringing three brook crossings in this area up to current road and bridge standards. This will leave only the major bridge replacement on Old Rt 12 for completion of Irene recovery. It is slated for next construction season as soon as ANR will issue a stream permit and will be covered at 90% FEMA, 5% State.

We wish Rock Webster and his hunting party success filling his moose tag starting this weekend. A very impressive bull has been seen in the designated permit zone and expected cooler weather and the onset of the mating season might get him moving and a little careless! Most everyone is reporting not much for deer sightings we expect because of extended mild weather and abundant food this year in the woods.

**VERMONT JOURNEYS TO CHINA
LEARNS ABOUT DEVELOPING SKIING INDUSTRY**

Governor Shumlin and his team are off on a junket to China to enlist help in developing the Jay Peak ski area in northern Vermont. It would include not only an expansion of Jay, but a new hotel in Newport VT, a depressed area with high unemployment.

“Not only would this make the new Beijing ski area a world class facility but it would be the first truly International Ski Area in the world”, said Shamlin.

A spokesman for the Chinese Development Corp. WETU-KANSKEE, Mr. Ching Chow Mein, said the only serious obstacle to the project was that Governor Shamelin wanted the VT Dept. of Taxes to start receiving tax revenues before the project started and in US currency rather than the Chinese yuan. In a side maneuver, the Governor suggested that the Chinese take over the Vermont Yankee Nuclear plant that Vermont shut down. It seems that Entergy Corp., parent company of Vermont Yankee, doesn’t want to continue taxes on a defunct facility, as Shamelin requested.

The Chinese are interested in the project as the facility could be converted to coal, and in Beijing they are already conditioned to polluted airy and Black Lung Disease.

When interviewed, one old Vermonter said, “I prefer the ‘Old Vermont’ where the State wasn’t always meddling in our lives”.





