EAST BARNARD'S 'LARGELY LOCAL' DINNER

TO RAISE FUNDS FOR COMMUNITY HALL ROOF

It's that time of year again, time for the 7th annual 'Largely Local' Dinner in East Barnard. This year's profits will benefit the Community Club's upcoming major project: a much-needed replacement of the Community Hall roof. The dinner date is Saturday, September 8, and the setting is the Community Hall. Serving times for the meal are from 5:00-7:00 p.m.

The name of the dinner comes from the locally-grown or locally-sourced foods on the menu, which includes the main course of roast turkey (white and dark meat), mashed potatoes, stuffing, gravy, maple-glazed carrots, and green salad with maple dressing followed by apple crisp and ice cream for dessert. Dinner prices are \$12 for adults; \$6 for children under 12; and \$3 for pre-school.

Other activities include a craft bazaar from 4:00-7:00; live music starting at 6:30; and the quilt raffle drawing at 7:30. Raffle tickets (\$1 each or 6 for \$5) and "Harbor" tee shirts (\$12 each) will be on sale beginning at 4:00. LISTER NOTES

THE TOWN WIDE REAPPRAISAL HAS BEGUN

As noted in the Listers report for Town Meeting this spring, the Listers Office is doing a town wide (complete) reappraisal of Barnard. The inspection of properties by representatives of New England Municipal Consultants (NEMC), Matt Krajewski and Ryan Silvestri, started last month

In order to avoid surprising people when the appraisers arrive at a residence for an exterior inspection, NEMC has sent letters to the landowners in advance. The first set of letters were sent six days in advance of the inspection period, but due to the vagaries of the USPS delivery, some of these letters were not received by the landowners until on or after the scheduled exterior inspection. In order to avoid this in the future, letters will be sent out two weeks in advance of the exterior inspection period. If you have not received a letter and would like to be present when the exterior of your property is inspected, please contact the Listers office at 234-9576 or e-mail us at Listers@BarnardVT.us

Landowners will be asked to be present for the interior inspections of residences and outbuildings. The landowners may arrange for a trusted third party to be present during an interior inspection if the landowners cannot be present for the interior inspection. In this case, the landowners should inform the Listers office of the name and contact information of this trusted third party in order for the Listers to arrange for an interior inspection. If a landowner, or an agent for the landowner, is not present, the appraiser will not enter the building. After an interior inspection is completed the owner or agent will be asked to sign the inspection record as proof that they were present during the interior inspection.

As this is a complete reappraisal of the town, it is important that complete, interior and exterior, inspections be made of all real property in Barnard, in order to have a fair and equitable assessment of all properties. If a complete inspection of a property is not possible, the appraisers will have to apply a subjective process that will be based on the highest and best use of the subject property as viewed by the appraisers.

Once inspections have been completed, and the initial Grand List values have been calculated, a booklet listing all the new appraised values will be sent to all landowners. Land owners will be given the opportunity to meet informally with the appraisers to discuss the valuation prior to the official Lister Grievance.

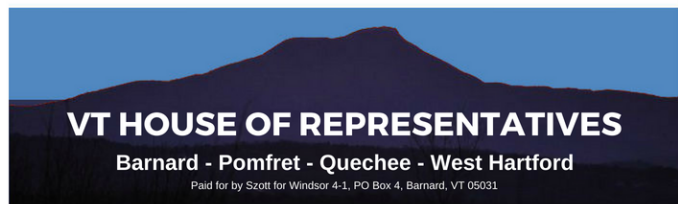
